William Kincaid was one of the most influential flutists of the 20th century. He described in great detail how to prepare intervals and connect one note to the next. This use of nuance and inflection creates a seamless and dynamically varied phrase that conveys the musical intent of both the composer and the performer, which is the key to communicating effectively with an audience.

Medical issues affecting flute players will be discussed, following which there will be an open question and answer session. Dr. Treister is a board certified orthopaedic and hand surgeon who practiced in Chicago from

1974 through 2014. While an orthopaedic resident at Northwestern University he studied flute at Roosevelt University and has been a dedicated amateur flutist ever since! He has a particular interest in repetitive trauma disorders relating to musical instruments, especially carpal tunnel syndrome.

The West Suburban Flute Orchestra (WSFO), founded by CFC Member David Kelsey, boasts a roster of 140+ flute players and is one of the largest flute orchestras in the United States of America. The WSFO has gained national and international recognition, particularly for its key emphasis of having 50% of the ensemble as low flutes (alto flute, bass flute, contr'alto flute, and contrabass flute), giving the ensemble many layers, depth, and a truly unique sound. WSFO consists of some of the finest flute players in the Chicagoland area and beyond and is known for its safe, welcoming, inclusive, and true family feel. Director, Dr. Mark Ponzo.

Workshop - Hristina Blagoeva, flute with Miles Massicotte, piano The Collaborative Process: Strategies for having an Easy Experience with Difficult Repertoire

Supporting the theme of the 2023 Chicago Flute Festival, "Together Again", let's explore strategies and techniques related to collaboration between flutists and pianists. The Flute Sonata by Prokofiev, op. 94. one of the most difficult pieces in the flute repertoire, will be used to illustrate points. Topics covered: collaborating with pianists; difficult flute repertoire; difficult collaborative repertoire; effective rehearsal strategies;

effective communication techniques; principles of effective collaborative performances. Flutist Hristina Blagoeva, native of Bulgaria, is currently on the faculty of Brightpoint Community College. Pianist Miles Massicotte is an Assistant Professor of Piano and Director of Keyboard Studies at Virginia State University.

Let's learn more about how voice science can inform flute playing and teaching in this informative and participatory workshop with singer/flutist, Dr. Sasha Garver. Explore research and exercises on Posture, Breathina, Tonal Resonance and Vowel Postures, and Vibrato. Scientific work of vocal otolaryngology colleagues, and therapy will be discussed to show how it is directly applicable to flute playing.



Denis Bouriakov

Established as one of the world's leading flute soloists, Denis Bouriakov was the winner of the 2009 Prague Spring competition, and prize winner at most major international flute competitions, including the Nielsen, Munich ARD, Kobe, Rampal, Nicolet, Larrieu, and others. He is currently the Principal Flutist of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, appointed by Gustavo Dudamel in 2015, and has previously served as the Principal Flute of the Metropolitan Opera in New York under James Levine. Denis has been combining orchestral and solo careers, regularly performing concertos and recitals worldwide. He has collaborated as a soloist with many prominent conductors, including Valery Gergiev, Daniel Harding, and Gustavo Dudamel.

His first solo CD, featuring the Bach Chaconne, Sibelius Violin Concerto, and other daring original arrangements, was released in 2009 and followed by a number of other solo albums over the years. His upcoming CD release, in collaboration with the Lithuanian Chamber Orchestra, features Romantic-era violin and flute concertos such as the Mendelssohn Violin Concerto. In addition to his commercially released solo albums, Denis has published hundreds of videos of live performances from recitals and concertos on his YouTube and IGTV channels.

Denis has held a full-time teaching position at the University of California, Los Angeles since 2017, alongside his fellow-flutist wife, Erin, who shares his enjoyment of collaborative teaching and duo performing. In 2018 he was appointed Visiting Professor of Flute to his alma mater, the Royal Academy of Music in London. The Academy previously awarded Denis the prestigious titles of Associate and Fellow of the Royal Academy of Music in 2006 and 2014, respectively. Denis leads many masterclasses for conservatories and universities worldwide and teaches many courses in Germany and Japan. He has been on the faculty of the Verbier Festival in Switzerland and the Pacific Music Festival in Japan, both of which he had participated in as a student. Additionally, Denis has been invited to adjudicate many international competitions. In 2019 he was appointed chairman of the woodwind jury by Valery Gergiev for the prestigious XVI Tchaikovsky International Competition.

Denis was born in Simferopol, Crimea, and was a prodigy flutist from a young age. At the age of 10, he was admitted to the Moscow Central Special School, where he studied with the famous Professor Y.N. Dolzhikov, the only French-trained professor in the USSR. With the support of the "New Names" International Charity Foundation and the Vladimir Spivakov Foundation, Denis toured as a young soloist in over 20 countries in Europe, Asia, South America, and the USA, performing for Pope John Paul the Second, Prince Michael of Kent, and the presidents of Russia, Romania, and Indonesia. When he turned 18, Denis went on to attend the Royal Academy of Music in London, studying with Professor William Bennett, OBE.

While studying in London, he competed internationally and freelanced as a Principal Flute with the Philharmonia of London, the London Philharmonic Orchestra, Leeds Opera North, and the Frankfurt Radio Symphony Orchestra. He won his first full-time orchestral position in 2005 as Principal Flute with the Tampere Philharmonic Orchestra in Finland, where he also taught at the Tampere Conservatory of Music. In 2008 Denis moved to Spain to become the Principal Flute with the Barcelona Symphony Orchestra under Eiji Oue. Later that year, Denis won the position as Principal Flute of the Metropolitan Opera in New York and has resided in the United States since 2009. With his phenomenal virtuoso technique

and musicianship, Denis looks outside the standard flute repertoire for works that would allow the flute to shine, continually transcribing and performing violin concertos and sonatas, and expanding the limits of flute technique and artistry. A number of his arrangements have been published by Theodore Presser, with a few in the works. Additionally, some of them are available as free downloads on his website.

Kay Kim

As an active chamber musician, pianist Kay Kim enjoys concertizing domestically and internationally each season. She performed in recitals with the members of Chicago Symphony Orchestra, New York Philharmonic Orchestra, Metropolitan Opera Orchestra and Paris Opera Orchestra, Chicago Chamber Musicians, the recipients of Stradivari Society Award, as well as with the faculties of the Juilliard School, Northwestern University and Indiana University, among others. She has been one of the pianists of Chicago Symphony Orchestra's conductor's rehearsals for over a decade, working with many distinguished conductors, including Riccardo Muti, Daniel Barenboim, Bernard Haitink, Mafred Hoeneck and Stéphane Denève and performed in CSO's subscription concerts conceived by Pierre Boulez.

Ms. Kim was heard on WFMT radio broadcasts performing in the company's 40th Anniversary Celebration as well as First Monday Series by Chicago Chamber Musicians, the Dame Myra Hess Concert Series, the Rush Hour Concert series, Impromptu and Jewel Box Series and has presented recitals and performances in major venues such as Bennett Gordon Hall Series at Ravinia Festival, Kennedy Center's Conservatory Project, Carnegie Weill Hall and the Grant Park Music Festival. She also has appeared in CBS Early Show performing with violinist Itzhak Perlman. As a former member of a musical ambassador group Trio Chicago and Friends, Ms. Kim traveled to over 20 countries presenting a comprehensive array of American music since 2006. Her chamber music performances can be heard in recordings on Summit Records and MSR Classics.

Ms. Kim teaches accompanying at Northeastern Illinois University. Her previous teaching and staff pianist positions include the Bienen School of Music at Northwestern University, the Jacob School of Music at Indiana University and the Juilliard School during the academic year and The Perlman Music Program, Music in the Marche in Italy and Alessi Seminar during the summer.

A native of South Korea, Ms. Kim attended Seoul National University for her undergraduate study and University of Michigan for her graduate degrees. She holds a doctoral degree in piano performance from Northwestern University.



2023 Lifetime Achievement Award Recipient Florence Nelson

Florence Nelson's illustrious career at the New York City Opera spanned over two remarkable decades of performing and touring experiences. Renowned as a flutist and piccolo specialist, she actively performed with prestigious orchestras, ballet, and opera companies across the New York City arts scene, including the New York Pops Orchestra, the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra, and the Casals Festival Orchestra, among others.

Florence's passion for music began with her academic pursuits in early childhood, earning a Bachelor of Music from Oberlin College in 1963, followed by a Master of Music Performance and a Music Education degree in 1964, both conferred by the Manhattan School of Music. Her path to excellence was guided by renowned flutists, including William Hebert, Robert Willoughby, Harold Bennett, Marcel Moyse, and William Kincaid.

Beyond her exceptional musical talent, Florence shared her expertise with future generations through extensive private teaching and faculty positions at Hofstra University and Greenwich House Music School. Her dedication has borne fruit, as her former students now hold esteemed positions in major orchestras and universities worldwide.

Florence's legacy extends beyond her musical prowess; she's been a dedicated arts administrator, exemplifying commitment, and unwavering advocacy to her fellow musicians. She represented her colleagues' rights at the International Conference of Symphony and Opera Musicians (ICSO) and served many influential positions such as Vice President of the Local 802 American Federation of Musicians (AFM) in New York, head of the Concert Department, and Executive Director of the Symphonic Services Division. Between 2001–2005, Florence was appointed Secretary–Treasurer of the International American Federation of Musicians, where she advocated for musicians' rights across the United States and Canada.

Florence's groundbreaking role as the first woman elected to a national office in the AFM underscores her trailblazing spirit. She addressed gender diversity within union leadership by founding the Organization of Professional Women in Music (OPWM). Through this initiative, she orchestrated mentoring programs and a newsletter, empowering women to assume leadership roles in an industry historically resistant to female pioneers.

Her unwavering commitment to musicians' rights, rendered successful negotiations of national contracts for the National Public Radio, television, and film industries. She holds honorary officer titles in ICSOM, ROPA, and OCSM, and was named Secretary–Treasurer Emerita of the AFM upon her retirement. Florence Nelson's enduring contributions resonate as a testament to her profound impact on North America's music industry.

Since making her home in Chicago in 2006, Florence has played an integral role in the Chicago Flute Club (CFC), assuming several key positions including President, Vice President, and Program Chair. She remains a pillar of support, providing mentorship, guidance, and invaluable expertise ensuring the club's continued success and vibrant future.

2023 Lifetime Achievement Award Recipient Phil Unger

Flute Center President and Owner / Master Repair Technician

Phil grew up in a house that was filled with the sound of his father's clarinet playing. It makes sense that Phil would pursue a life that revolves around instruments and helping people make music. As a child, Phil learned the clarinet and later took up the contrabass clarinet. He later enrolled and attended Ohio University and received a degree in Radio and Television, but over the years he never lost his passion for music.

He realized early on that he had an innate ability to take things apart and put them back together again. After taking a repair class at the Heidelberg College in Tiffin, Ohio in 1976, Phil decided to follow his passions for music and repair. He enrolled in the best musical instrument repair program in the country, Allied Repair School in Elkhorn, Wisconsin. It was while at Allied that he discovered his special talent for repairing flutes. He excelled in this department. After spending one year working and training in Wisconsin, Phil moved to Dallas to manage and repair for a large music store.

Realizing the need for competency with professional flute repair, he decided he needed to learn much more. The techniques for repairing professional flutes are a world apart from those requirements needed to repair student flutes and require special training. Phil's desire to focus on professional flutes led him to apprentice as a private student with world-renowned repairman and flute maker, Jim Phelan at the Verne Q. Powell Flute Company in Boston. Phil continued his education at Powell by repeat visits to concentrate on different aspects of flute construction and restoration. Working side by side with Jim opened up a whole new world for Phil and really helped him to hone his professional flute repair skills. He opened his first business in 1980 across the street from Fair Park in historic downtown Dallas.

Phil relocated his business to the heart of Manhattan. Phil has been overseeing the day-to-day operations of the Flute Center of New York and growing it into the valuable member of the industry and flute community it is today. Recently rebranded as The Flute Center, and announcing the opening of their new Chicago location, it is the largest seller of new and used flutes in North America. Phil has created a center with unwavering commitment to customer service, expert knowledge of flute brands and models, and an unmatched inventory of in-stock flutes, headjoints, piccolos, altos, and basses.

It has always been important to Phil to develop a sense of community and giving in the flute circles. The Flute Center has their own live-streamed masterclasses and concerts as well as an interview series, "Flute Unscripted." In addition, they continue to support the work of clubs like the Chicago Flute Club. The Flute Center has parterned with the CFC to provide 40 sponsored students memberships for each of the past 3 seasons offering the resources of membership to students who otherwise, would not be able to afford to participate.

A recipient of the University of Texas System's Regents' Outstanding Teaching Award, she currently serves as Associate Professor of Flute at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater and Director of the UW-W Flute Camp. 




